



here are more than 10,000 conservation areas in England, spanning 2.2% of the country – that's about the same size as Luxembourg!

Conservation areas are managed by local authorities, who have identified those places of special architectural or historical interest as deserving of careful management to protect their character

CANADA

The Canadian Register of Historic Places (CRHP) defines a heritage district as "a place comprising a group of buildings, structures, landscapes and/or archaeological sites and their spatial relationships where built forms are often the major defining features and where the collective identity has heritage value for a community, province, territory or the nation.

A heritage conservation area is a distinct district with special heritage value and/or heritage character, identified for heritage conservation purposes in an official community plan.

Characteristics of heritage districts

Although each district is unique, many share a common set of characteristics. These may include:

 A concentration of heritage buildings, sites, structures; designed landscapes, natural landscapes that are linked by aesthetic, historical and socio-cultural contexts or use.



- A framework of structured elements including major natural features such as topography, land form, landscapes, water courses and built form such as pathways and street patterns, landmarks, nodes or intersections, approaches and edges.
- A sense of visual coherence through the use of such elements as building scale, mass, height, material, proportion, colour, etc. that convey a distinct sense of time or place.
- A distinctiveness which enables districts to be recognised and distinguishable from their surroundings or from neighbouring areas.

The main attributes that define the special character of an area are its physical appearance and history, i.e. the form and features of buildings and the spaces between them, their former uses and historical development.

A special amenity area (sam) is an area which has amenity and/or heritage characteristics which set it apart from the surrounding residential environment, with aspects or characteristics that contribute to the pleasantness of an area. The special characteristics may include attractive street trees and mature on-site planting; a unique topographical environment (such as a river setting); architecture and site layout of a specific period in history; consistent age, scale and style of dwellings or an intimate street scene.

A Heritage Conservation Area (HCA) is an area recognised and valued for its special historical and aesthetic character. Important elements that contribute to the heritage significance of a HCA include the architectural style of buildings, fences, trees and gardens.

WHAT IF THERE ARE NO HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREAS?

The current situation would remain the same. Areas where there is unique character and streetscapes of uniform buildings – the attributes that make a place special – would continue to be gradually eroded. Unsympathetic development on one lot in the middle of a group disturbs the uniformity and balance and encourages further unsympathetic change. There would be no certainty for people buying into a reighbourhood for its special character and no guarantees for the existing residents that things would not suddenly change.

A submission regarding a demolition of a Federation house in Caledonian Street provoked this response. "Our type of heritage streetscape is disappearing. It would be most positive if this intact pocket of history opposite a heritage listed park, be duly protected." (Trim 14/78/04)

Throughout Rockdale City there are examples of neiver, larger houses being built in areas that have an established character. Character defined by rows of similar or identical Federation or inter-war period houses for example. New buildings often remove one of the original houses and replace it without regard for the existing historic streetscape, disrupting the uniform character of the street.

In some cases this has not affected the other residents in the street but in many cases it has caused great concern as people feel they are



losing the character that makes their street special. The introduction of HCA would enable policy to be developed to manage change in these special streets cases.

HAS ROCKDALE CITY COUNCIL PREVIOUSLY CONSIDERED HAVING HCA?

The 1991 Rockdale Heritage Study identified a number of areas that had special historic and streetscape qualities. These precincts have not been made into HCA.

The 2010 Heritage inventory Review also recommended that intact street scapes of the same period which retain their original character should be included as HCA in the heritage schedule.

HOW IS A HERITAGE CONSERVATION AREA MADE?

A HCA is defined legally by including it in the Rockdale Local Environmental Plan. Management of the HCA is included in the Rockdale Development Control Plan through guidelines for development in heritage conservation areas.

There is a statutory process for making changes to both these documents that includes public exhibition and notification to affected property outputs.

This Discussion Paper is not part of that process, all property owners affected by any HCA proposals would be notified in a separate process. WHICH PLACES







- 1. Describe the special features or characteristics that justify the designation
- 2. State the objectives of the designation
- 3. Specify the guidelines respecting the manner by which the objectives are to be received (OCP or zoning bylaw)



Take no action

CONSIDERATION

Within 30 days, Local Government must:

- a) file a notice in the land title office; and
- b) give notice to the Heritage Minister

The main purpose of conservation area designation is to acknowledge the special character of an area.

This influences the way in which the council, as the local planning authority, deals with planning applications that may affect the area.

Within conservation areas, permitted development rights may be restricted. This means that permits are required for certain types of work that may not normally need one.

Regulatory

- Acknowledge special character through regulations
- Permits may be required for certain works
- Design review for changes

Social/Quality of Life

- Stability and enhanced certainty
- Sense of place
- Supports sense of permanence

Economic

- Provides use of local materials and skills
- Can be labour intensive resulting in the creation of more jobs
- Contributes to heritage tourism

Environmental

- Fosters an increase in recycling
- Saves embodied energy
- Promotes green practices
- Decreases urban sprawl

Examples of types of development that may require a heritage alteration permit:

- Demolition of all, and in some cases part, of any building or structure.
- Extensions that extend beyond the exterior envelope of the building.
- Design review for new construction.

- Any enlargement or extension to a roof, such as the addition of a dormer window.
- An extension or alteration to any structure within the grounds of a building, if it is visible from the public right-of-way.
- The installation of a flue, chimney or soil and vent pipe if it would be visible from the public right-of-way.
- Positioning a satellite dish on a wall, roof or chimney that is visible from the public right-of-way.

- Cladding any part of the outside of a building with materials such as stone, artificial stone, timber, plastic or tile.
- Changes to doors or windows.
- Replacement of doors or windows that can be repaired.
- Solar panels on a wall that is visible from the public right-of-way.
- Review of signage and advertisements.
- Trees within conservation areas may be protected.








Figure 2: Map of Galt Heritage Conservation District

Conservation Districts

Our conservation guidelines are applied in varying degrees to the different conservation districts. We have to take into consideration the historical significance of each conservation district, the context of the surrounding developments and the long-term plans for the area. The extent of the building to be conserved and the degree of adaptation allowed also varies by district, and in some cases, by the uniqueness of the subject building.

THE HISTORIC DISTRICTS OF BOAT QUAY, CHINATOWN, KAMPONG GLAM AND LITTLE INDIA


The Historic Districts—the oldest urban areas of Singapore—were first gazetted on July 7 1989. The strictest form of building conservation is practiced in these districts. These districts enrich our built environment with their diverse facades, rich ornamentation and unique architectural styles. To maintain the ambience and physical character of these historic districts, strict conservation guidelines have been put in place. For example, the entire building envelope, including the rear service blocks and rear courts are to be retained and restored, to maintain the overall low-rise scale and fine grain of the urban texture.







